

Each year our Community Report Card provides a brief overview of what we've accomplished over the last 12 months. As we look back at 2022, we see a year of "more" - more referrals, more people served, and more dreams and goals achieved by those we support.

We have seen an over 200 percent increase in Early Intervention in Harrison County over the last five years. This incredible statistic means more babies and toddlers are receiving the therapies they need to learn and grow.

The County Board's preschool is a *Step Up to Quality* 5-Star rated learning center, the highest award given by the Ohio Department of Education. That means we exceed standards in preparing children for kindergarten and beyond.

We believe that how we are is as important as what we do. This manifests itself in our commitment to children via our Tomorrow's Youth Project, a multi-system, trauma-informed approach that helps children and teens with behavioral challenges achieve balance and healing.

The need for Direct Support Professionals has never been higher and our Quality Supports team assisted more people than ever before to become DSPs in 2022. We are also part of Ohio's DSP

Retention Payment Initiative, a first-of-its-kind investment into the incredible providers who help people live, learn and work.

We continue to add to the quality of life for adults with disabilities in Harrison County through opportunities for job-related skill development, employment, housing, and transportation.

There is so much more to a fulfilling life than just having our needs met. That's why we connect people with disabilities to the community and the things they want, like places to live and learn, work and worship, volunteer and play.

In other words, we want every person we serve to get "more" out of life.

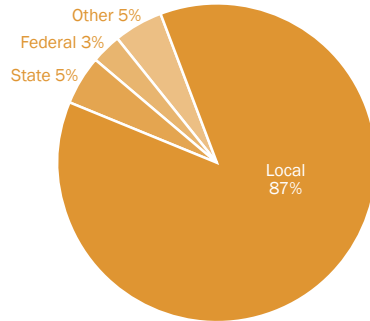

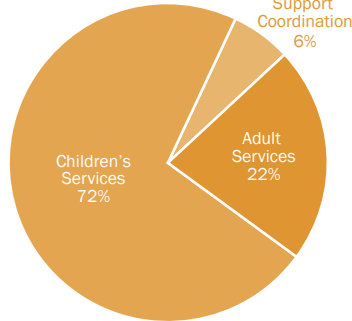
